Unit of Inquiry:

The gallery walk and mystery box engagements provided students with interactive and immersive experiences to explore the concept of media. By examining various communication methods and distinguishing between verbal and nonverbal forms, students deepened their understanding of how messages are conveyed and interpreted. These activities not only enhanced their comprehension of communication but also encouraged collaborative learning and critical thinking.

In recent activities, students engaged in insightful discussions and reflections on the needs and significance of mass communication. Through these discussions, they connected their understanding with the concept of "media," exploring how communication occurs on a broader scale.

Students identified the unit is under the transdisciplinary theme How we express ourselves





Students researched the meaning of "media and medium "and participated in a debate to display their knowledge on the words

Later through the key words students unpacked the theme and using unscramble the words strategy, they unpacked the central idea of the unit.

Students shared their understanding of central idea and collaborated with their peers to find out the dictionary meaning of the words media, medium, express and powerful etc,.

Through their exploration of media elements and types, students gained a thorough understanding of how different media functions and their various uses. By analyzing content, format, design, and different media types, students developed a deeper appreciation for how media shapes communication and serves diverse purposes. This comprehensive exploration has equipped them with the knowledge to critically evaluate media and understand its impact on their daily lives.















Transdisciplinary Language

Students co-constructed the spell-list for the week, that will help them to enhance their vocabulary.

Students made transdisciplinary connections with tenses. They participated in group discussions to analyze and interpret the visual examples. They practiced identifying the tense used in each scenario and discussed how the choice of tense affected the meaning of the sentences. Students completed task where they filled in blanks with the correct tense form, creating sentences that accurately represented different times and actions. For example, they transformed sentences from simple past to present continuous.

Transdisciplinary Math

This month, our inquiry into addition and subtraction has been both engaging and effective. Students explored these fundamental concepts through a range of interactive experiences, including story problems, online games, and collaborative math board games. These activities not only deepened their understanding of mathematical operations but also encouraged creative and reflective approaches to problem-solving, aligning with our commitment to inquiry-based learning and active engagement.













































Hindi:

Students recited the poem & खरगोश राजा (Khargosh Raja), focusing on specific criteria. They also read a short story मीना की जादुई देखभाल, and identified the repetition of nouns, suggesting possible changes. They defined the term Sarvanam (pronouns) and created a mind map on pronouns. Additionally, they constructed sentences using the pronouns from the story, shared examples of pronouns from their daily lives, and framed questions related to the story, providing written answers.

French:

In the month of September students will learn the irregular verb "Faire" .They will also learn vocabulary and expressions related to Weather conditions using Faire verb.

Telugu:

The students delved into the concept of nouns through Panchatantra stories, applying their knowledge in interactive games and enhancing their reading skills by creating and answering questions. They recited animal-themed poetry, receiving feedback from peers and being assessed on their pronunciation, voice modulation, and memorization. Additionally, they analyzed and compared nouns from various poems and stories, deepening their understanding of the subject.

Spanish:

In the month of August 2024, students learned definite articles, Alphabets, classroom objects,

Spanish countries and nationalities some irregular verbs like "SER, Estar, vivir" and conjugation

concept relating to introduce oneself and others along with questions.







Drama:

In our recent theatre unit, students delved into the art of voice modulation, focusing on three distinct types of voice: soft, base, and louder voices. This exploration was designed to enhance their vocal skills, deepen their understanding of character portrayal, and elevate their overall performance abilities.





Visual Art:

In class, students created posters to explore the fundamental elements of art: Line, Shape, Form, Color, Value, Space, and Texture. They learned how to use poster colors, including mixing, diluting, and layering. By experimenting with primary colors (red, blue, and yellow), they created secondary colors and explored tints and tones. This activity helped deepen their understanding of color theory and enhance their artistic skills.









Music:

In our recent music classes, students were introduced to the exciting world of body percussion through a series of engaging patterns. Using song phrases, they explored six different body percussion techniques: clapping, tapping, snapping, stamping, patting, and creating "shhh" sounds. This hands-on approach not only helped students develop their rhythmic skills but also allowed them to experience the joy of making music with their own bodies. The activity fostered a greater sense of rhythm and coordination, making it a dynamic and enjoyable part of their music education.

Compulsory Telugu

Students have been introduced to some of the letters క(ka),ద(Dha),ల (La),ఊ(U),ఊ(UU),ఇ(E),ఈ(EE),త(Tha), ఋ(Ru),ౠ(Ruu),ణ(Ana),and also learning some simple words using these letters watching PPT.

PE

Students took part in the 60 meters, 200 meters, and 400 meters sprints, ensuring a proper crouch start position for each race. They competed in these track events, with individual times recorded for each participant based on their performance in the respective events.

ICT:

Students began by learning about Microsoft's history and its impact on the technology industry. They explored how Microsoft has evolved from its early days to become a global leader in software and hardware.

Using multimedia presentations, students discovered the key milestones in Microsoft's history, including the development of Windows, Office Suite, and other innovative products.

Students discussed Microsoft's role in shaping the modern computing landscape, reflecting on its contributions to technology and how it has influenced everyday life.







Dance:

 In our latest dance session, students delved into a fresh set of hip hop moves, showcasing their dedication and enthusiasm. Under the guidance of our skilled instructors, they learned and perfected a series of dynamic steps that are sure to elevate their performances. To hone their skills, the students practiced these new moves by counting to eight in sync with the music. This technique is essential in hip hop, as it helps dancers align their movements with the beat, ensuring precise timing and fluidity. By repeatedly practicing in this manner, they were able to refine their techniques, adjust their timing, and develop a stronger sense of rhythm.

The combination of learning new choreography and practicing with structured timing is crucial for building muscle memory and enhancing overall performance.

Our students are making great strides, and their progress is evident in their growing confidence and improved execution of themoves. We're excited to see how these new skills will be incorporated into future routines and performances. Unit of Inquiry:

In the coming weeks, students will embark on an insightful exploration of how people interpret and respond to media. This comprehensive study will enhance their understanding of media's impact on audiences and the various factors influencing interpretations and reactions

Students will present their findings from individual or group research on media interpretation and response, fostering a collaborative learning environment and encouraging diverse viewpoints.

Transdisciplinary Language

Students will explore the elements and steps involved in persuasive writing.

They will deepen their understanding of persuasive techniques while continuing to read books to enhance their literary skills.

Additionally, students will collaboratively create a weekly spelling list and participate in weekly spell-check.

Transdisciplinary Math

Students will delve into understanding the relationship between addition and subtraction. They will explore how these two operations are interconnected and how mastering one can aid in understanding the other. As part of this exploration, students will engage in solving a variety of word problems that illustrate these concepts. This hands-on practice will help solidify their comprehension and application of addition and subtraction in real-world scenarios.







Additional languages:

Telugu:

The students will be introduced to Nouns through panchatantra stories. Students will also play a game (names, places, things and animals) to apply the concepts they have learned so far. They will also be asked to read panchatantra stories and frame questions to enhance their reading skills. They will also have to frame important questions for the poem read by the teacher and answer those questions accurately (Reading, speaking, writing, listening). Students will recite the poem and seek peer feedback & feedforward.

Spanish:

In the month of September They will learn some regular and irregular verbs like "Tener, AR verbs and conjugation method, they will continue to revise adjectives, pronouns, articles, verbs concept.

Students will practise the language skills in their daily Spanish communication and collaboration skills as they work together in Spanish.

Hindi:

The teacher will share a story from Bal Kahani. Students will use the I See - I Think /-I Wonder strategy to list their observations and thoughts. They will then share their perspectives with the class. Following this, students will write a short story, paragraph, or sentence using pronouns. The teacher will then read a poem about children, which the students will listen to carefully. Afterwards, students will recite the poem and seek feedback and feedforward.

French:

Students will learn vocabulary on clothes. They will also learn verb conjugations which help them to express what they are wearing or what size of cloth they will need to buy.







Music:

In our upcoming music classes, students will explore hand-free exercises featuring eight distinct rhythmic patterns, which will help them understand and calculate tempo using keyboard octaves. This innovative approach will not only refine their rhythm techniques but also introduce them to the fundamentals of staff notation and music symbols. By connecting these rhythmic patterns with staff notation, students will gain a deeper appreciation of musicology and develop essential skills in reading and interpreting musical scores.

Drama:

In the upcoming month, students will embark on an exciting journey into the world of emotions and expression as part of our theatre program. This new focus will provide them with valuable tools to enhance their performances and better connect with audiences through the powerful use of emotional expression.

Dance:

In the continuation of our choreography lessons, students will learn the next set of dance movements, focusing on space and timing in hip hop. They will practice these movements in sync with the music, further enhancing their coordination and rhythm. This progression will help them perfect their hip hop routines and develop a deeper understanding of dance dynamics.

Visual Arts:

Explore the concept of balance in artwork. Symmetrical, Asymmetrical & Radial balance. Along with poster color . Introduction to clay modelling using addition and subtraction method (Making ganesha).







PE:

Students will participate in a 600 meters run with a standing start position, and individual timings will be recorded. They will watch a video on the relay race, focusing on baton exchanges, and will practice these techniques. Additionally, students will be introduced to the field event of the standing broad jump.

Compulsory Telugu:

In the month of August they will be continue learning letters and ఎ,ఏ,ఐ, ఒ,ఓ,ఔ అం,అ:,మ,జ,ట,న and also simple letters, numbers,week names,Body parts,animal names,flower names in Telugu.

ICT:

The students will understand that "Microsoft Word is a word processing software developed by Microsoft. It allows users to create, edit, and print documents, including text, images, create tables and graphics." The students will learn more about the following:

- Edit and format text, images, and graphics
