Unit of Inquiry:

Students further explored social and emotional well-being. They attended guest talks by different faculty across Dance, Music, PE, Art, Drama, Inclusive learning department and Reading. They discussed about their feelings and emotions by making real life connections to their daily life. They reflected on their learning in their well-being journal.

TD Language:

Students practiced reading and writing of different CVC words using the vowels a,e,i,o,u to enhance their writing skills. They learned to read and write different sight words. They further strengthened their reading skills through ORT books.





TD Math:

Students reinforced the number patterns such as missing numbers, skip counting by 2,5,10, number comparison, ascending and descending order through different learning engagements and ta

Art:

Students explored how to make secondary colours using 2 primary colours with different materials like pencils, crayons and paints. Students differentiated the primary and secondary colours and used them to colour the national flag. They inquired about the importance of colours and used them to create a Rakhi. sk sheets. They used colours to share their experiences by creating artwork related to Janmashtami celebrations. Students then co-constructed the assessment task and criteria to display their learning of colours.

Drama:

Students were engaged in various role plays. They learned about differences between characters and roles. They learned to work in teams, to negotiate roles, to perform and to demonstrate teamwork.





Dance:

Students have learned elements of dance (Action) like nod, shake, hand swing, knee lift, clap, roll and body postures.

Music:

Students were introduced to tune. Students listened to two pieces of music- one in tune and out of tune and shared the similarities and differences between them. Students practiced singing with the teacher reflected on whether they were singing in tune or not. Students identified the song/rhyme played by the teacher in two different pitches and shared the similarities and differences. Students made connections with Approaches to Learning Skills and attributes of learner profile.

PE:

In this month Learners explored jumping and practiced forward, backward and sideward jump enhancing their Gross motor skills.



Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Unit of Inquiry: Transdisciplinary Theme:

How we organize ourselves

Central Idea:

Transportation systems evolve over time to meet the needs of the community

Lines of Inquiry:

•Features of transportation systems

•Decisions involved in using transportation

•How systems of transportation respond to changing needs

Key Concept: Form, Function, Change

IB Learner Profile: Social Science, Transportation, Systems

Unit of Inquiry:

Students will be tuned into their new unit by provoking them with interactive and fun activities. They will come up with creative reflections helping to assess their prior knowledge opening up the unit to deeper conceptual understanding. They will build their vocabulary in the process.

TD Language:

Students will enhance their creative thinking skills by using CVC words and sight words to create simple sentences. They will be doing reading comprehension using different tools and strategies to further develop their reading skills. They will also explore different action words.





Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

TD Math:

Students will move beyond hundred in the number sequence. They will learn to write number names and explore the concept of data handling. They will enhance their creative thinking by engaging in logical reasoning learning engagements and task sheets.

Music:

Students will be introduced to tune. Students will listen to two pieces of music- one in tune and out of tune and share how they are similar and different. Students will practice singing with the teacher and self reflect on whether they were singing in tune or not. Students will identify the song/rhyme played by the teacher in two different pitches and answer the similarities and differences. Students will learn sunshine, sunshine smile, happiness songs with the teacher using electronic keyboard as a resource. Students will connect with Approaches to Learning Skills and attributes of learner profile.

Art:

Students will further inquire about the elements of art by exploring the next elements of art lines. They identify different types of lines and their importance in creating the artwork



Drama:

Students will learn about different kinds of expressions. They will learn about different emotions through engaging in activities in class. Situation-based activities will be given to help them to feel a better emotion better and express it to others.

PE:

In the month of September, learners will be engaged through the following:

- Learners will explore and practice running.
- Learners will practice hand and leg movement in running.
- Learners will explore zigzag running.
