Mindfulness & Well-Being

Students actively participated in different mindfulness exercises like Pin-Wheel breathing, Superman Pose, Shark Fin breathing, Volcano breathing and Wonder Pose. Unit of Inquiry:

Students were tuned into the new unit "How we organize ourselves" through different learning engagement. They unpacked the word "Transportation" through a mystery bag activity and explored different modes of transport. They also sorted vehicles into categories of Air, water and land. They enjoyed creating 3D model of their favorite vehicle using cardboard.

TD Language:

Students were introduced to nouns and 'sh' Digraph through different learning engagements. They practiced framing simple sentences using CVC and sight words through which they enhanced their reading and writing skills.





They further strengthened their reading skills through ORT books reading comprehension using different tools and strategies to further develop their reading skills. Students practiced sequencing the story through various learning engagements to deepen their conceptual understanding.

TD Math:

Students were introduced to number names 1 to 10,2D shapes properties and Bar Graph. Students explored the properties of 2D shapes by building them using various materials popsicle sticks, toothpicks, straws or playdough. They practiced bar graphs as part of the data representation of their favourite mode of transport.

Music

Students were introduced to tune. Students listened to two different pieces of music- one in tune and out of tune and shared how they are similar and different. Students practiced singing with the teacher and reflected on whether they were singing in tune or not. Students reinforced about pitch of the song. Students learned sunshine, sunshine smile, happiness songs with the teacher using electronic keyboard as a resource.







Art:

Students worked on making idols of Ganesh for Ganesh Chaturthi using the moulds. As the part of the inquiry into the elements of arts, students inquired into the next element of art line. They were introduced to the different types of lines in an artwork. They practiced to make the lines different ways and relate the lines from the surroundings. They further explored the importance of lines in the artwork – like for expressing the feelings and showing the action by using the lines in the emojis and stick figures.

Drama

Students explored about the emotion scared through scenario-based activity. Students practiced role play enacting a situation using the emotion scared and reflected on their learning.







Dance:

Students learned elements of dance (Action) like nod, shake, sway, knee lift, clap, roll and body postures.

PE:

In this month Learners were engaged through the following: -

 Learners explored and practiced throwing, underarm throw and upper arm throw through various physical activities.

Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Unit of Inquiry:

Transdisciplinary Theme:

How we organize ourselves

Central Idea:

- How systems of transportation respond to changing needs

Unit of Inquiry:

Students will start making connections and understand the decisions involved in using transportation through various learning engagements .They will build their vocabulary in the process.

TD Language:

Students will enhance their thinking skills by using nouns and sight words to create simple sentences. They will work on reading comprehension using various tools and strategies to further develop their reading abilities. Additionally, they will explore different action words.







Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

TD Math:

Students will practice writing numbers up to 200 in the number sequence. They will learn to write number names and explore the concept of data handling. They will be introduced to 3D shapes. They will enhance their creative thinking by engaging in logical reasoning learning engagements and task sheets.

Music:

Students will revisit tune & elements of music. Students will listen to two pieces of music- one in tune and out of tune and share how they are similar and different. Students will practice singing with the teacher and self reflect onwhether they were singing in tune or not. Students will connect with Approaches to Learning Skills and attributes of learner profile.

Art:

As the learning process progresses, the students will be assessed of their learning of

lines. Students will start working on the artifacts for the farmer's market.

Drama:

Students will continue exploring different emotions and expressions. They will learn through situation-based activities to explore emotions like wonder and angry.

PE:
