# Learning and Teaching – December & January

## **Unit Of Inquiry:**

How we organize ourselves

#### **Central Idea:**

People play different roles for the safety and wellbeing of communities they belong

## **Lines of inquiry:**

- Various communities we belong to
- Roles of people who are part of our communities
- Our responsibilities towards community's safety and well being

### **Key Concepts:**

Form, Function, Responsibility

## **Unit of inquiry:**

The students tuned into their third Unit of Inquiry, "How We Organize Ourselves." As part of the provocation, they were given a mystery box containing various flashcards of tools used by community helpers. The students picked a flashcard, identified the tool, and matched it with the community helper who uses it. After this, they were asked a few questions about community helpers to assess their prior knowledge. Following the discussion, the students were introduced to different community helpers, including doctors, dentists, veterinarians, teachers, police officers, and traffic police, and explored their roles and responsibilities in ensuring the well-being of the community.







## Language:

The students revisited the second set of Jolly Phonics, which includes the letters c, k, e, h, r, m, and d. They were also introduced to the letters g, o, and u from the third set. Through activities like letter identification, phonics sounds, and related objects, they learned to connect sounds with these letters. The students practiced phonics through songs, stories, and games. They also worked on forming letters and built their vocabulary through storytelling and picture discussions. These fun activities made the learning enjoyable and helpful.

#### Art:

The demonstration was given to the students of paper tearing and pasting in the given picture. They explored and experienced the paper tearing and pasting artwork using coloured papers and glue sticks. As the learning process continued, the students were introduced to the artwork of joining dots to understand the lines. Students worked on the assessment on printing, and paper tearing and pasting artwork topics.

Math: Students were introduced to backward counting from 10 to 1 and reinforced their learning through engaging activities, such as arranging numbers in reverse order and playing a hopscotch game where they jumped on numbered squares while counting backward. They were then introduced to numbers 11,12,13,14 and 15 through flashcards and games. These activities made learning enjoyable and helped strengthen their understanding of number sequences.







#### **Dance**

Students developed freestyle dance skills in three techniques, improving body coordination, balance, and movement through stretching and basic moves. They also gained insight into placing performance within cultural, historical, and theoretical contexts

#### **Drama**

Students worked on the following areas demonstrating the attributes of communicators for

- Identifying the emotions Surprise and Angry
- Imitating the two or more expressions..

#### PE

Students started their learning on basic gymnastics skills.

- They began performing simple side rolls and forward rolls in gymnastics.
- Students reflected on their understanding of the side roll and forward roll.
- They performed forward rolls and splits.

#### **Music**

The children learned to sing rhymes with lyrics (pronunciation) and music (rhythm and tune).

#### **Vocal Exercises:**

They practiced solfège in C (5 notes) in Western music (Do, Re, Mi, Fa, So).

## Rhythm:

They learned to clap in a 4/4 rhythm and used percussion instruments (egg shakers) to reinforce the same.

# Learning and Teaching - Month Ahead

## **Unit Of Inquiry**

The students will tune into the fourth Unit of Inquiry, "Sharing the Planet," where they will explore various aspects of animals, including the roles animals play in people's lives, the suitability of specific animals for particular functions, and our responsibility for their well-being.

## **Transdisciplinary Language**

Students will explore letters from the third set of Jolly Phonics, focusing on letter formation, phonics sounds, and vocabulary development. They will enhance their skills through activities like tracing, stories, picture talk, and other engaging tasks.

### **Transdisciplinary Math**

The students will be introduced to numbers 16 to 20 through engaging activities like oral counting, tracing, and writing numbers. They will use songs, rhymes, and tally marks to enhance their understanding while staying actively engaged.

#### Art

Students will continue working on the joining dots artwork and will be introduced to various shapes.

They will reflect on their understanding of previous learning through a task sheet.







# Learning and Teaching - Month Ahead

#### **Drama**

Students will work on the following areas demonstrating the attributes of communicators for

- Props
- Use of props

#### Music:

The children will learn to sing the song "Say Hello," which introduces greetings in different languages.

**Song:** "Say Hello" (greetings in different languages)

Vocal: Solfège (Do-Re-Mi-Fa-So) in C

**Rhythm:** Clap on the first beat of 4/4, use egg shakers

**Dynamics:** Practice soft (p) and loud (f) singing

#### PE

- Students will be engaged in different learning activities related to sprints in athletics.
- They will participate in balancing exercises in gymnastics.
- Students will perform short sprints and activities related to them.

#### **Dance**

- Students will develop improvisation skills in movement creation.
- They will enhance improvisation abilities to discover a range of new movement possibilities for the dance style.
- They will achieve a high range of movements.
- They will practice body hops.
